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to presume that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...anyone that would vote for an override is doing it purely for financial reasons. And I don't think that is a valid issue. I don't think that's something we ought to presume, and I don't think we ought to do this to put the Legislature in a position to act on that. So again, I agree also, it would be very hard to explain to voters as to why they should vote for this, particularly when I think an opponent to it could simply make an effective argument that it really isn't needed. So again, I oppose the advancement of the resolution. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Any further discussion on advancement of LR 18CA? Senator Redfield, there are no other lights on. Do you wish to close on your motion?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. As a parent of young children, I noticed a very distinct difference when I went into a store with my children and they would see things that they wanted and they'd say, mom, will you buy this, mom, will you buy that; but if I gave them money before we went in the store and said, you may buy whatever you want with that money, they oftentimes walked out with the money still in their pocket. They made different choices, because all of a sudden they felt that money was theirs, and they made their choices a little more responsibly. Now, that may or may not happen. Senator Raikes, that's a matter of conjecture. But certainly I think that we need to face the fact that when we as a state take on more and more obligations for small portions of our population, we in fact increase the burden on the rest. So think about that property owner, that low-income property owner, who is not 65 years old, who's paying 100 percent of the property burden, and they're going to pay all of the voter-approved issues that come out on the ballot. And feel just as tender in your heart toward the burden on them as you do for these folks, because I feel it for both of them. But I think this gives us the flexibility as a Legislature...if you think the Legislature needs to have the ability to decide this in tough budget times, then vote for it.
