And subsection (c) says, the Legislature may authorize gaming at up to eight facilities in the state of Nebraska. I say the Legislature "may" authorize gaming at up to eight facilities in the state of Nebraska. The Legislature shall provide for the operation...the Legislature shall provide for the operation, regulation, and taxation of gaming at such facilities. That is what the amendment does. It allows the Legislature to decide, or authorize gaming at up to eight facilities in the state of Nebraska. This will allow every corner of the state, if they so choose to, and it's feasibly possible for them to operate a casino in those areas. That is for us to decide. That's for the Legislature to decide. And that is what I've been harping to you since we started this argument. At least we do have, the Legislature does have control over where those eight facilities are located at. And it would be up to us, then, to authorize them. That...you know, with eight, I thought it was a better solution, because that could include the western part of the state. And I certainly believe that they have as much right to argue their position of whether a facility should accommodate that part of the state. So often we think about just the eastern part of the state. But it...and it also could include all of the tracks we have in the state. All depends on how you look at it, I think we have had this particular type of gaming in this state for years. And that's been at the racetracks. That has provided a lot of dollars for agriculture. It's provided a lot of dollars for the city of Omaha, and Lincoln, and Columbus, and Grand Island. You take those away, take those out of those communities, it's one of their main drawing attractions to those communities. And we've seen that happen in Omaha with Ak-Sar-Ben going down. They do have a facility there now with Horsemen's Park, and I understand that that is doing quite well. So you see, we've been...we've had this type of gaming for years, and just didn't realize exactly what it was. So that's...it's a very clear, straightforward amendment and proposal. And it has brought the two sides together. Not everyone. Not everyone is happy with this. And I know that. But in order for us to move something ahead and put something on the ballot this year to give the
