I'm not sure, in the absence of an effective consent calendar, that this measure would have had a chance to see the light of day this year, even though the Revenue...the Natural Resources Committee has reported this out twice unanimously. So I'm grateful to Senator Schrock and to the members of the Natural Resources Committee. I urge the adoption of AM0561.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. You've heard the opening on AM0561, offered by Senator Schrock to LB 165. Open for discussion on that amendment. Senator Landis, followed by Senator Hartnett. Did you wish...

SENATOR HARTNETT: On the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Schrock, there are no further lights on. Did you wish to close on your amendment? He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is adoption of AM0561. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on adoption of AM0561, offered by Senator Schrock to LB 165. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Schrock's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment was adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schrock would move to amend with AM0562. (Legislative Journal page 676.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, you're recognized to open on AM0562 to LB 165.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is LB 29. LB 29 was advanced by the Natural Resources Committee unanimously. It amends the original 1981 Municipal Cooperative Financing Act in three ways. The agencies created under the act may engage in the supply of electric energy and power projects, along with water, sewer, and solid waste projects. The Municipal Energy Agency of Nebraska, other
