SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the court could stay it only if all four of these items or criteria were complied with in 84-917.

SPEAKER BROMM: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. That's all I'll ask you. Senator Bromm, because my time is just about up. Members, I'm going to fight this bill. I'm not fighting it for drunks. I'm not fighting it for the liquor industry. I'm fighting it for my concept of justice. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. It is 10:30 and, as the agenda states, General File, 2003 senator priority bills. Before that, Mr. Clerk, do you have any items?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. LR 39 is reported back to the Legislature for further consideration after it had been referred to the Health Committee. I have a Reference report referring a gubernatorial appointee. Amendments to be printed: Senator Dwite Pedersen to LB 303; Senator Baker, LB 608; Senator Jones to LB 452. That's all that I had, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal pages 842-843.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. (Doctor of the day introduced.) As stated, General File, 2003 senator priority bills. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 756, a bill by Senator McDonald and others. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 22 of this year, at that time referred to the Health and Human Services Committee. Bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments, Mr. President. (AM0727, Legislative Journal page 776.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator McDonald, you're recognized to open on advancement of LB 756.

SENATOR McDONALD: Mr. President and members, I'm proud to bring you LB 756, the Cancer Drug Repository Act Program (sic). Most of you are familiar with this bill because I had a lot of cosponsors on this bill. If your name isn't on it, you still
