change this, and it probably does need to be freshened up because it hasn't been talked about significantly since 1987. But the fact of the matter is the program works. And we had extensive discussions in executive session and I think the general sense is, at least for me is, is that we want to satisfy the citizens' concerns for some sort of reform, some additional disclosure, some wage requirements, whatever that may be, but I think that if we leave here and that we have significantly harmed LB 775, then we will have done the wrong thing for our constituents. Could it be freshened up? Should it be talked about? Absolutely. But if we harm this program in a significant way, I think that we will harm our state for years to come. I'm generally supportive of the committee amendments. There are some things that trouble me, particularly the slaughterhouses. It's interesting to me that I grew up hearing slaughterhouses called as meatpacking facilities, but as soon as want to attach a negative connotation to that and eliminate them from the LB 775 credit mix, that all of a sudden they are attached a negative name, such as slaughterhouses. But I'm going to support not putting in the slaughterhouses. I think they should be exclu...or included in the LB 775 mix. And I've got some pretty good information of what value-added is, and I was just discussing this with Senator Loudon. I think one of the most important things that we need to do and start concentrating on here in Nebraska is increasing our...is increasing adding value to our ag products. And until we do that, I think this state is going to continue to lag behind financially. We're one of the leading producers in corn and beef and pork and one of the last producers in terms of making flour out of that wheat or steaks out of that beef. We need to start adding value to our products. And I do believe that while the slaughterhouse industry, the meatpacking industry is not perfect, I think that we need to add some value. Again, I think if we leave this session having significantly harmed LB 775, we will do an injustice, a disservice to our constituents. However, I do believe that now is the time to look at it, some additional disclosures, some wage requirements, and that's what we're doing here. I'm going to support a significant part of the committee amendments, but there are some things that I think need to be worked on.
