SENATOR CHAMBERS: And thank you, Mr. President. I just have a question for Senator Landis. Senator Landis, this method of determining value is only for assessment purposes,...

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, that's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...not if the state or the city were going to condemn and take that property.

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right. Right. This is for assessment purposes only. In the case of condemnation, there's a separate decision as to the value under the condemnation court as to, you know, what a taking is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I just wanted that clearly in the record so that nobody could feel that as we discuss this that had been considered and this particular section was to be taken in consideration and in conjunction with the condemnation statutes. So now that's clear, thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Landis.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Seeing no further lights, the motion before the body is to advance LB 292 to E & R for engrossing. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. It is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wehrbein would move to return LB 292 to Select File for specific amendment AM1072. (Legislative Journal pages 1097-1100.)

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. This is LB 803, having to do with TERC, the Tax Equalization and Review Commission. Our committee introduced several bills along with our appropriations process preliminary report. One of those was to reduce the living expense allotment that we have for our TERC commissioners. They must be appointed by district, and in our present law they are entitled to reimbursement up to \$20,000 for living expenses.
