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good idea, I'll generally get a puzzled look on their face, and they will say...they will say something kind, but the puzzled look is really a look of, are you nuts? Concealed carry doesn't make a great deal of sense to me personally, and it doesn't make a great deal of sense to the majority of my district. Now, I've had my staff try and locate information on the Internet, opposed and in favor of concealed carry, and have found ample information both ways, all easily refutable. I think this boils down to, what do you think is right for the state of Nebraska as a whole? And I understand that we all have different districts, we all have different interests, and our constituent bases are all different. But what this boils down to, in my mind, is there are two elements to this bill, very simply. First one is, is it right to carry a loaded gun? And the second one is, is it right to carry that gun concealed? You can throw out all the other information, all the other arguments. Should people carry loaded guns? Should people conceal those loaded guns? I think not. What this bill also doesn't necessarily...doesn't at all address is, should people that have emotional disorders, bipolar, suffer from severe depression, should those people somehow be qualified? We check criminal background, but we certainly don't qualify whether or not they are competent to carry a loaded gun. Senator Combs, you made an interesting statement. You said that this bill will not increase the number of sales of guns, or firearms, in Nebraska. What it will do is increase the number of guns on the street, hidden within clothing or in cars. And let me give you an example of one that I fear. If anyone knows my legislative aide, Jeni Bohlmeier, you know that she's about five-foot-nothing and has an attitude. Well, Jeni said that she's got four guns at home, most importantly a nine millimeter, and a .45 with a scope. And the minute this passes, she's going down and get registered, and she's packing. That scares me a lot. People will be injured because of heat of the moment arguments, heat of the moment rage on the roads. And I fear...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR MINES: ...this bill is detrimental to the future of Nebraska. With that, I yield back the rest of my time, Mr. Speaker.
