have questions, I would be glad to answer them. But I would request your support on this. Because if this does not advance, then we still have the same problem, the caucuses are not the same. That was the purpose, was to make those two caucuses the same membership. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hudkins. We're now open for debate on the motion to advance. Senator Hudkins, there are no lights on. You're recognized to close if you care to. She waives the opportunity to close on advancement. The question before the body is, shall LB 510 advance to E & R Initial? All in favor of that motion vote aye, and opposed nay. Question for the body is to advance LB 510, offered by Senator Hudkins, to E & R Initial. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 707 (sic).

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 510 does advance. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 707 by Senator Quandahl. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 22, referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments at this time to the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Quandahl, to open on advancement of LB 707.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, LB 707 was heard by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee on February 27 of this year. It did advance 8 to 0. Just in sum, currently an election commissioner in counties of 100,000 or more inhabitants cannot become a candidate for elective office within three months after his or her term has expired, whether or not he or she has served the entire term. LB 707 would amend current statute, Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 32-208 to provide that an election commissioner cannot become a candidate for elective office within six months after leaving office. Just in short, what it changes is, is it
