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the public side, that would be my preference to have an entire level field for all of these, a level playing field for all of these extracurricular activity transfer subjects. So with that, Mr. President, I would yield to questions or encourage my colleagues to make their positions known on this particular point.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the opening on AM1260 to the committee amendments. Those wishing to speak, Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I do appreciate Senator Bromm bringing this amendment with this concern, but I do oppose the amendment. Number one, the amendment did not have a hearing. The issue did not have a hearing. The issue of transfers was never brought up during the entire debate of the student option program. And what I'm saying is, from the time the bill was introduced, when it was heard, until I saw the amendment on our gadgets addressing this issue. I have spoken with NSAA. They said they do have a transfer committee. They will be meeting and I have pledged to Senator Bromm that between now and next session we will look at this issue. We will try to establish some guidelines. At present, there are no statutes. I am not sure, I do not know where this would fit. We, as I introduced the bill, I have spoken specifically that this addresses the student option enrollment program, students transferring from one district to another under the rules and statutes of the student option program. Those are my comments. I know that the amendment was brought forth by a concern of, I believe...and maybe I could ask Senator Bromm. Could...I would like to address some questions to you, Senator Bromm.
