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LB 755 takes a look at the Capitol building, the Nebraska Capitol Commission. And the Nebraska Capitol Commission is a commission that consists of the Governor, also the Speaker of the Legislature, also the Chief Justice, and then a couple of other architectural types, and three persons appointed by the Governor. And this preexisting commission, under the amendment, would have its powers and prerogatives enhanced. And this commission would be making recommendations with respect to the hiring of the person who would be in charge of the Capitol building, and with a variety of policy decisions relating to the Capitol building. This commission could make recommendations. But the final decision is made by the office of the administrator of the Capitol building, who is appointed by the Governor. Everything that I will be talking about now, please understand that the office, the person, is appointed by the Governor, and...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...is working for the Governor. But the advantage of this system, from the Legislature's point of view, is that our representative, the Speaker of the Legislature, is directly involved in this commission, which is directly involved in making recommendations to this newly created administrator of the Capitol building, making recommendations on what policies are going into effect in the Capitol building and, therefore, input into the decisions that affect you and I in our daily work lives down here in the Capitol building. So overall, I think it's fair to state that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...the purpose of the Nebraska Capitol Commission, as it is...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time is up, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...enhanced...and I will come back to this as soon as I have a little more time.
