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I will turn my light on and finish what I have to say the next time I'm recognized. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Smith. You did not wish to speak to the Hudkins amendment? Senator Wehrbein, did you wish to...did you wish to speak?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, I'll wait till my motion comes up.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, your light is next again, then.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And Mr. President, since I'm just, as Alexander Pope called it, expatiating free, I'm going to continue. People have come from other parts of the country and marveled at this building. It has even been recognized by architects and architectural societies in other countries. People who are close to something never appreciate it for what it is. It becomes so familiar that you don't even see it. I bet if I told people to look away from the front of the building, they couldn't even describe or sketch out what the front part of the building looks like. Sometimes I sit here and I count the number of stones on that back wall, the number of stones on that little projection that goes just in front of the back wall. I multiply. I just do all kind of things, because this building has quite a bit that it can say to you, if you will listen. What this amendment that is being discussed would do is create a structure that is here after we're gone, after the current Governor is gone, the current DAS operator, whoever may be appointed to this position, will be gone. This care of the building is what ought to be institutionalized. It should be put in statute. And I know legislatures can change statutes. But to the extent that we can ensure it through action by the Legislature, we ought to. And I know there are people who might not like that notion. But we should look beyond the moment and see what it is that we're attempting to do. Preserving this building would be one of the greatest things which, as a Legislature, we could do. One of these times, I'm going to talk about, as I have on other occasions, the poor shape that the legislative branch was in. Senator Friend, how would you feel if you had invited people into your office, and you had a desk
