or however it's going to be defined, described, enumerated, or pointed out. The Primary Class Development Fund has higher priority than solving the state's budget. You're cutting money from higher education. Nothing is being cut from this fund, so this fund has a higher priority. I'm not sweating the last one, because I say again you're going to come back to me on that one. I don't fish, Senator Landis, but on television I've seen them take a stick with a little twirler or reeler on it and they throw it as far as they can and a piece of string with a hook and something to trick an innocent, beautiful fish, so it will take the hook, then they start turning the crank on that reel and they pull the fish in. If it's a big fish, to wear it out, they let it out again so that it can run around and think it's going to be free, think it can get its liberty back, thinks it can live the way nature intended to live, but there was an intervening force known as a human being. So they turn the little reeler and pull the fish in. Well, Senator Vrtiska, he's looking at me, I usually acknowledge those who look at me when I'm speaking, I threw the little hook out there and Senator Vrtiska took it, and I'm going to reel him in. Wait till we get on the budget bill. And you know what I said you're going to be like returning to what, quoting you know who from where. This one is different. There is nothing I'm aware of that the Appropriations Committee is doing on this, so I will ask Senator Wehrbein. Oh, he's not here. I presume nothing is being done on this particular passage in the statute. I want to take this \$1 million away. I don't want it to go into this fund for the next 15 years. I don't want it to go into that fund any more. After the effective date of this bill, should it become law, LB 759, the language I'm talking about will cease to be the law. And I believe that ought to be done. Otherwise, not everything is on the table. Senator Louden voted the proper way on the last one, the intelligent way, the informed way, because he doesn't want to be returning to you know what. On this one, it's clear that there's only one primary class city in the state of Nebraska. That would be Lincoln. You did what you did last time to help Lincoln, but you didn't need to do it that way. All of these amendments that I'm offering on this first division of the question relate to how cigarette tax money is to be spent. There is no relationship between the raising of that tax and any problem created by the smoking of cigarettes. If this
