ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to LB 332, Senator  
Beutler would move to return the bill to Select File for  
specific amendment. That amendment is AM1211, found in the  
Journal on page 1219.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler, you're recognized to open on

because this is an opportunity, maybe the last opportunity, to  
attach to this bill a bill that came out of Business and Labor  
Committee relating to workers' compensation. And I wanted to  
thank Senator Hudkins for allowing me to propose it here at this  
particular stage. The bill is not one of the most exciting  
bills. It deals with process. It seeks to clarify how workers'  
comp claims will be processed in situations where the same claim  
has maybe...may well be filed in more than one state. Legal  
jurisdiction matters are one of the most complicated areas of  
the law. In fact, in law school you have a whole course  
dedicated to it. It's called conflict of laws. And depending  
on various factors, you may be able to file, for example, a  
workers' comp claim, for the same injury...and we're talking
