SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Beutler on the Smith amendment to LB 407.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback. Senator Jensen, I was talking a little bit on the side as you were speaking, and so I may not have heard everything that you said. But I wanted to try to clarify particular situations. If I'm remembering correctly and have been informed correctly, they...there is about \$1 million, or originally there was about \$1 million for each congressional district for public health and minority health. Is that right? I would ask if Senator Jensen could respond, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you respond?

SENATOR JENSEN: The total amount of the...for the state?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: We actually have in minority health \$3.2 million. We have...

SENATOR BEUTLER: And how was that...wasn't that divided among the congressional districts,...

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...being...each district being equal population, more or less?

SENATOR JENSEN: We actually...and because of the minority...the way it's distributed across the state, we had \$1 million going to the Congressional District 2, we had \$1,580,000 going to Congressional Districts 1 and 3. There's a satellite office now in each congressional district.

SENATOR BEUTLER: All right. So it was a million two, \$1.2 million, to the 1st District?

SENATOR JENSEN: One million going to the District 2; 1.58 going to 1 and 3.
