SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: This will be your third time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...members of the Legislature, I just had to pass on to Senator Landis this little brainteaser, is what it's called, but it's the note on the back side that caught Senator Thompson's attention. It says, protect LB 775 from the budget knife, and the caption at the top is, leave no millionaire behind. (Laughter) Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Landis, you're recognized to close on AM1713.

SENATOR LANDIS: This represents about, let's see, 4...almost \$6 million of revenue, almost \$7 million of revenue. They're pieces that we've done before but, in fact, it's more efficient than LB 759 with respect to this because of the E clause, which we need for the maximum return on the liquor tax and maximum return on the estate tax issue. I would ask for the adoption of the amendment. We may be reduced in numbers and we'll have to have a call of the house, but I'd ask for a board vote and see where we are. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. You've heard the closing on AM1713 to LB 283. The question before the body is whether that amendment should be...Senator Landis, did you ask for a call of the house? He did not. All in favor of the AM1713 vote aye, and opposed nay. Voting on AM1713 to LB 283. Have you all voted who wish to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Landis' amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers, I now have a floor amendment, excuse me, FA1355.
