SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator McDonald. Senator Burling on the advancement.

SENATOR BURLING: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I too want to thank Senator Bromm for bringing this bill to us, and all the work and time that has been spent on the process of bringing it this far. And I'm encouraged by the interest of the Department of Agriculture, and they will hold public hearings. That will be the time for the public to express their opinion on it. And counties are still in control. They can choose to be a part of that or not be a part of that. And so I'm excited about what could happen in the country as far as livestock promotion, but it's still up to the individual county how they want to approach that. So thank everyone on both sides of the issue for their interest and time and discussion, and for the support of my colleagues. Thank you.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I too also want to thank Senator Bromm for being patient with this.
