Mr. President, I have a priority motion.

SPEAKER BROMM: Members, very briefly, of course we have a motion to adjourn until next Tuesday at 9:00 a.m. All things are subject to change except the starting time, which will be 9:00 a.m. We are planning Tuesday afternoon, providing there are some vetoes, to take up some veto overrides, and hopefully Tuesday morning the Appropriations Committee will have some opportunity to review any vetoes and be prepared to make recommendations to the body by two o'clock Tuesday afternoon. Wednesday, I would remind us all, would be the last day, if things go according to schedule, for us to amend bills that might be on Final Reading and to place bills on Final Reading, with Thursday being a layover day, Friday perhaps being some Final Reading. And if things go according to a possible schedule with that scenario that we could be in a position to not need to return for that ninetieth day after the weekend. The Governor has assured us that he will be timely with his consideration of bills and turn them around, providing we give him an opportunity to do that, so that we would have knowledge of any vetoes at least by a good time next Friday. So with that, I would say thank you for a very, very hard week and some very good work. And, Mr. Clerk, if you'd take up the motion, please.
