SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. Did you wish to proceed while they're checking in, Senator Brashear? Senator Dwite Pedersen, Senator Landis, Senator Price, Senator Bourne. You may continue when you care to, Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you. Mr. President and members of the body, I believe I'm correct in saying that there is nothing about LB 759 that any of you want to know that you do not know. In my experience here, we have had extended, thoughtful, productive debate. There has been as much conversation, at least from my perspective, about this legislation as any other off the floor. I thank everybody for the time and attention devoted to it and for the doing of it, and I would ask that we override the veto. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Mr. Clerk, read the motion that's before the body, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is that LB 759 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SENATOR CUDABACK: All those in favor of the motion vote aye; all those opposed to the motion vote nay. And this will be a record vote. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 2047.) 37 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on the motion.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful and I do raise the call. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Brashear would move that LB 759A become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
