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SPEAKER BROMM: Next item on the bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a priority motion: Senator Chambers would move to bracket the resolution until May 30 of 2003.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, a resolution does not have to go to the Governor. It can be passed the last minute of the last day that we're here. I want to ask Senator Brashear a question to determine for myself how serious I am about this bracket motion.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Brashear, would you yield, please?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brashear, you've set up that trust fund in your amendment. If that were stripped from your amendment, would you still support your amendment, if that fund were removed?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: It depends on what it was replaced with, if anything, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If it were just removed, not replaced with anything.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I'd have to think about what the consequence of removing it and not replacing it with anything would be, but I...I'm open to considering that. It's just that I'm, you know, slow.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I'll give you 25 seconds to think about it, or do you need more time than that?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well, I might need a little more time than that.
