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SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, I'm on the Transportation Committee, and I heard this, and we worked on this quite awhile, trying to figure out just how to exempt people in agriculture and parades. And I'm supportive of the bill, but I was only supportive of it if we could get them two things in it. And we've got them exceptions in it right now, but with what Senator Beutler is saying now, I think we need to do something to get us all on the same page and be able to go forward. Because what I'm really concerned about is, a man has got a bunch of young people detasseling corn, and they go around town and pick up the...all the people that's under 18 to go out there to help, and they...maybe he's got a pickup to do it with. And that's the reason we tried to exempt agriculture on this. And also, parades, they brought out some good examples, but I'd just give you the example of the parade in...like, in Broken Bow. If you want to be in the parade, you've got to go get you a number and get in line, and that number will identify whether you're in that parade or not. And so I think that's pretty clear on that, because I know that if you don't have the number, you just can't get in the parade. And so I think that clears that up. But we need to get on the same page, and I suppose the best way to do it is just sit down and do it and work something out, so that we don't overlap with our statutes. Thank you. And I want to give the rest of my time to Vrtiska.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may proceed, Senator Vrtiska. About a minute and a half have elapsed.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Jones. Thank you, Senator...Speaker, or President. I just wanted to touch on the issue about permits for parades. You know, I attend an awful lot of parades in my district, and none of them ever have any permits. You show up there, they put you in line, and you drive through the parade. And they've got kids, they've got everybody. And I can vouch that nobody ever issues anybody a permit. They just allow them to have it. And if you go to those small towns and ask for a permit, they won't know what you're talking about, because they've never had permits. I
