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numerous states, and they felt that was too high. The DMV worked an agreement out with these people to lower it from...their request, from \$30 down to \$18. Everyone is on board with that. That's what the committee amendment does. If you only want 1,000 records, it's going to cost you \$18 now, instead of \$12. And this really is just covering the cost of procuring these records to DMV. They're not making a lot of money on this. So I would urge the adoption of the committee amendment, AM0329. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Baker. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. "Mr. Governor," excuse me. Members of the Legislature,...oh, I see the "Congressman" approaching his seat. Members of the Legislature, you know...you all know I give nicknames to people around here. There's "Baron" Tyson, "Squire" Wehrbein, the "Duchess," to my right. I used to have a name for my seatmate to my left, but I'm going to not risk it right now, because she's too close to me and I won't be looking her direction while I'm talking. But I think it's appropriate to nickname the Lieutenant Governor by just dropping the "Lt." Because actually, "L.T." stands for Lawrence Taylor, in my mind, one of the greatest linebackers of all time, who played for the New York Giants football team. And the congress...we have several congresspersons here, so from time to time you may hear me pay homage to you for that purpose. Now, down to cases. I have to ask Senator Bromm...I meant Senator Baker, a couple of questions. Senator Baker, I have to level with you. This is my first look at this bill, because I've been occupied during the previous days of the session. Was this bill drafted by the Department of Motor Vehicles?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, it was.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did the committee do any work, in terms of modifying what had been presented in the original bill, other than this committee amendment we're looking at? I'm not talking
