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it's...actually, yes, it is AM0328. AM0329 was adopted. This allows it to go from \$60 down to \$36. The green copy proposed \$60. This was only in the case of 2,000 or fewer documents. So the reason they're two separate amendments is, we did the one, and another group came in, said, we would agree to this bill if you lowered it to \$36 per 2,000. Once again, I...it's only for 2,000 or fewer. If you ask for more than 2,000, then it...instead of a \$36 rate, it's \$18 per 1,000. A cleanup measure, gets everyone on board, and I would ask for adoption of the amendment. I also...to clarify Senator Chambers' question about section numbers and problems there, it...obviously, it's the same bill drafting procedure using for everyone--renumber the remaining sections accordingly if the amendment is adopted. The...I believe it was Section 34...33...34 in the amendment Senator Chambers is referring to is Section 33 in the green copy. It's standard bill drafting procedure. And if you'll look on the last line of the AM2177, which we'll get to here in a bit, it's just, renumber the remaining sections accordingly. So that should answer the question there. I would ask for adoption of the amendment, AM0328. Thank you.

SPEAKER BRONN: Thank you, Senator Baker. You've heard the opening. Debate on AM0328. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have a few questions to ask Senator Baker on this amendment that he's offering. Senator...

SPEAKER BRONN: Senator Baker. Excuse me. Would you yield, Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Baker, the amount was originally \$60, and you are now reducing it to \$36?

SENATOR BAKER: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What was the amount before it was raised to \$60?
