other things that this has the potential for doing is to prevent crimes. As we mentioned, rapists in the old bill, but the thing that we don't...didn't mention is that they usually, on average, commit 8 to 12 rapes before they're arrested and convicted. If you were able to identify these people after one, you would solve or prevent the seven to ten rapes that might have occurred. So I think this, you know, is a very important part in this. One of the other things that is mentioned in this article that I have, and I've passed around to the Chamber, is that the cost per rape, so to speak, is \$87,000. So, by what I was talking about, if you increase this to four times, it would be \$350,000. And, you know, it's kind of a sad day when we're talking about dollars in this sense when we're talking about crimes that are devastating to a person's life for their entire life, so I don't think that we want to get caught up in just the financial aspects of this. But I do want to say that since there isn't...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...a financial statement with this that we have consulted with the State Patrol about doing this and I have received no strenuous objection from them. So I think that hopefully speaks for their support about this as well. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Johnson. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I take a particular interest in this bill because the provision requiring burglary and robberies felons to be tested comes out of LB 662, which is...which is my bill, and Senator Johnson and I have been working through the details of this. I just wanted to point out to you that there's substantial evidence that folks who commit burglary and robbery are involved...are oftentimes involved in more serious violent crimes and there is yearly, already, evidence that a few of those people are being identified by virtue of having been DNA tested in other states at other times, and they're being picked up for other violent crimes by virtue of this DNA testing. The...both the anecdotal and the compiled information indicates that it makes total sense
