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Section 33 through 36 of the amendment become the operative...become operative on January 1 of 2005. That completes the amendment. And like I said, the amendment does become the bill. And you should have that copy on your desktop computer. With that, Mr. President, that will conclude the committee amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stuhr would move to amend the committee amendments with AM2480. (Legislative Journal page 534.)

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Stuhr, to open on your amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. We have been working very closely with the Health and Human Services Department in their licensure and regulation. Yesterday it was brought to our attention that there were some technical amendments that needed to be done. And so with that, we bring you this amendment. And as I said, it really is just some wording that needs to be changed; does not change any of the concept of the bill. So with that, I would ask for your support on this amendment. Thank you.
