caravans, parades, and exhibitions. And as I said before, there's no clear definition in our statutes that I could find. Even though there is a mention of caravans...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: ...in the statutes, there are no specific definitions of those particular caravans, parades or exhibitions in Nebraska statutes. I would again say this is a criminal statute. It's to be strictly construed, and so we should know what we're enacting into law before we make criminals out of these drivers; again, a criminal conviction that would...that would subject a driver to a criminal conviction, fines and points off their driver's license. And so, in summary, I think it just makes sense to have an exemption for vehicles traveling at 25 miles per hour or less, and that's what AM2236 does. I would urge you to adopt this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Senator Landis has not checked in. Senator Landis. Senator Quandahl, do you wish to wait on Senator Landis? You're agreeable to proceeding without him? Okay. Members, we will proceed then. The question before us is the adoption of the Quandahl amendment, AM2236. All in favor vote aye, and opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to vote? Please record.
