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SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...just maybe, my colleagues will agree that the best thing is to show concern for all children. The lack of concern was shown with LB 172, depriving young women of information. So that's the "keep them ignorant" vote. The rejection of Senator Schimek's amendment was the "keep them unsafe and in danger" vote, and that is done in order that profit takers can benefit from the endangerment of children. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Now Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I have a question for Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR SMITH: Senator Aguilar, I recall a time when I was under 18 that I was at a camp, and we were going out for a hike, and the transportation to the beginning of the hike was in the back of a farm truck. There were several of us, and we did go more than 25 miles an hour. Everyone lived to tell about it. And I'm wondering if the current situation...it was not an agriculture-related situation. But I'm wondering if such an activity would be a criminal activity under LB 227.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, it would.

SENATOR SMITH: On the basis that it was going more than 25 miles per hour and they weren't strapped in. Is that right?

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's correct.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members. First of all, I want to thank DiAnna Schimek for brining...Senator
