not change because our outlook toward the world may be very gloomy. So I'm sure there are rural interests who may see this as a great bill, and feel, as Senator Schrock suggested, that any substantive amendment offered should be vigorously fought against. We expect that on bills of this nature. But I'm sure Senator Schrock understands that those of us who disagree with parts of this bill will fight vigorously against those parts we disagree with. One of the things I'm going to want to get into as we proceed is the makeup of this task force that brought to us this bill and the committee amendment. But before I proceed, I'm going to ask Senator Schrock a question. Senator Schrock, this committee amendment is the original bill plus those bills that you had designated LB 830, LB 831, LB 833, LB 1172, and LB 1173. Is that correct, that this committee amendment consists of the original green copy of the bill and those bills whose numbers I gave?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So there is no difference between what is in the committee amendment and the green copy as far as the original language in the green copy of the bill?
