SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...some rural people on this floor who have a vote. And because of that, some accommodation is going to have to be met. I will say that if no accord can be reached, when the time comes finally to take action on this bill, if we have not found a way to dig ourselves out of the hole, fiscally speaking, that we are in as a state, I'm not going to support this bill, and I'm not going to support any other bill with an appropriation. There are others who may feel the same way, but they won't say it. I believe, with all of the work that is being done on this bill, and the sincerity on the part of people working on this bill,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...whichever way they feel, it's time for the truth to be spoken. Did you say time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I did, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing on FA1520, which is an amendment to FA1502, the first division of the divided committee amendments to LB 962. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on an amendment to the first division of divided committee amendments. Have you all voted who care to? Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. The amendment has been adopted. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.
