SENATOR BAKER: I'm going to call them off by the location: Plainview, Axtell, Trenton, and Central City.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Plainview, Axtell, Trenton, and Central City.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. And so under those circumstances, those four plants that LB 1065 seeks to fund, would those plants also then qualify under your amendment, on AM2713 to LB 479?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR ERDMAN: So the plants that we're seeking to fund under LB 1065 already meet the requirements of production, and they're going to meet the 15 million dollar (sic--gallon) production by October 1 of 2004?

SENATOR BAKER: Well I assume they will. They're under the gun. They have to if they're going to qualify for LB 775.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: The reason we differentiated those, Senator Erdman, is those people have used LB 775 in their business plans, Central City, Trenton, and Axtell. Axtell is actually producing at over 15 million gallons annually now. Those plants have signed agreements. Those are in their business plans. We did not feel it was fair and equitable to those two plants that are not up and producing yet to pull that out from under them.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. And those are all the questions I have for you, Senator Baker. Thank you. Members of the Legislature, if you'll look at the amendment--and I'm going to point out on page 9, the existing language in statute is on page 9. The existing language says that any employment or investment which is eligible for benefits under the Invest Nebraska Act may also be included in, and create incentives for, a project under the Employment Investment Growth Act, the Employment Expansion Investment Act, and Rural Economic Opportunities Act. It outlines all these acts that you could be a part of. What
