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SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield to a question from Senator Chambers, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...somewhere in the work that the Appropriations Committee is doing, is there money that is intended to be appropriated for the State Fair?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: For this year, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that would be something the budget committee is going to present to the floor.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, Senator Landis and "Senator" Radcliffe...not "Senator" Radcliffe, "Emperor" Radcliffe, can get the Legislature to move this today, but you're going to have a fight with me on the budget bill. And maybe what we will agree to do is take that segment out that relates to the State Fair and deal with it by itself, so the rest of the budget might have a chance to progress. I'm not going to support anything for the State Fair now. This is the kind of thing they do to my Legislature. I usually say you-all's Legislature. Well, now I'm bringing it to a point where it's the kind of Legislature that I think it ought to be, so it's my Legislature I'm talking about now. In my Legislature, we're going to have a big fight over any money for the State Fair in that budget bill, and there are other matters that I have an interest in with reference to the budget. Income tax increase is what I want, not sales tax increase. So we're going to have a lot of other things to fight over anyway. But it's going to be interesting if the State Fair becomes a thing
