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SENATOR CUDABACK:    Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT:    Mr. Speaker, I mean Mr. Chairman, members of the body, that would be, I think, would be a good amendment, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    And I would like to ask Senator Hartnett another question while I have him on his feet because I think these amendments are going to move pretty rapidly. Senator Hartnett, I've been lobbying for a job for myself after I get out of the Legislature and I can't take a job where people are going to be telling me what to do and ordering me around. I'm just beyond that. But I had posed the possibility of a job being created that would have me taking the statutes as they appear now and the supplements that are applicable and start at page 1 and read it word for word, line by line and all of the things that I find in the way of language that I think could be improved I would make note of those, call those things to the attention of the appropriate authorities in the Legislature, which I no longer would be one, and see whether they thought legislation should be drafted to make those changes. Have I been conducting myself in such a way that you think I might be able to handle a job of that kind were it to be created and offered to me?

SENATOR HARTNETT:    I...

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Senator Hartnett, you may answer if you wish to.

SENATOR HARTNETT:    Mr. Speaker and...Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Chambers, I think you would be an excellent person for that. You'd probably have to get approval of the, what, Executive Committee, to do that (laugh)?

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    I...we might have to do that, but that's all I need from you, Senator Hartnett. Thank you. And, Senator Friend, not to leave you out since I'm on the committee amendment and it's really not going to anything in the bill, I'm not asking you these questions because there's really no need.
