not the availability of high-quality early childhood experiences that the family can afford to have. And so...and yet, if we have them go into school and their only experience is to fail in comparison to much older, possibly more advantaged children, then is school just going to become one experience of failure after another? And so I'm not sure what the answer is. I happen to believe that the answer is this amendment, or at least part of the answer. But it's going to need a lot more in terms of us making sure that all children have opportunities for high-quality experiences, preschool experiences, because education has become not just K-12, but pre-K-12. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Brown. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?
