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input from their perspective on making this information available. And I appreciate Senator Schrock. I think he is sincere, and I think the other people would be as well. I wanted some additional assurance on the record that we could sit down, we could discuss it. And that's helpful to me. Thank you, Senator Schrock.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Preister and Senator Schrock. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I'd yield my time to Senator Schrock, if he would like it.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock, you have just under five minutes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, I won't take the five minutes. Senator Chambers, I think the committee addressed a lot of those concerns of the people who testified against the bill. One of them was a nutrient management issue, and one of them dealt with cold water class A streams. And even I made very clear to DEQ that I want our pristine waters protected from large livestock facilities. So I think we addressed a lot of those issues. Didn't address them all, probably never will. But certainly the committee tried to address the issues that were brought up by the opponents. And if I would have been the original drafter of the bill, there would have been some of those things in there that we put in in the amendments. And one of the things we did was strengthen the cold water class A streams issues, and we did strengthen the issue on nutrient management plans, that weren't in the original bill. And some of that was the reason we had opposition to the bill. So with that, I would give the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schrock. I see no further persons wishing to speak. Senator Preister, you'd be recognized to close.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President. In the spirit of working together collegially, I would suggest that if I pull this amendment now, which I'm considering doing, and then
