SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...the authorization to reduce or discontinue is contingent upon at least that provision. Now when it says it has to be available for every person, does that mean available in the region where that patient...in that patient's home region, in the region of their residence? Or does that mean it has to be available someplace in one of the six regions?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you respond?

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you. Yes, I'll respond. Those same services, identical services, will have to be provided for that individual before he moves out of that hospital, that regional center. And so when we say the regional center services, that's the same services that he's receiving there will have to be available in a community-based center. Now certainly I would hope that those would be available in every one of the regions. And if not, perhaps that region might even contract with an adjoining region. But those services that the person is receiving in that regional center must be available in the community...in the region.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So if it happens...if the service they need happens to be a lockdown facility, then obviously, some patients from some regions are not going to be in the same region. They will have to come to whatever is open, Lincoln, Omaha, right?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I think almost every region will have a secure environment within their region. Most of them () right now. And...

SENATOR BEUTLER: A secure environment that will be able to hold for an indefinite period of time...
