I think it gives some warning, and there's time next year to make some changes under careful scrutiny, under time frame that we can discuss. We have a much better idea of the revenue at that time, maybe even a better idea what we're...expenditures are going to be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...from the Appropriations Committee, what are concerns. The one thing I can promise is, our demands are going to continue to go up on the state budget. Next year we're going to have health issues and we're going to have Medicaid issues. Those things are going to continue to go up. So we are looking...I think the best we can do is keep planning in some kind of time frame. This at least helps those entities that are depending upon us. So I urge you to carefully consider this, going to \$1.10. And we can move on to other issues. And we can, obviously, hopefully, if it does pass, we can do it, we can have some more debate on Select File. I would ask for a roll call vote, Mr. Speaker, and in reverse order.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. You've heard the closing on AM3027 to AM2792 by the Education Committee to LB 1093. The house is under call, and all members are present or accounted for. Mr. Clerk, call the question on the...the roll on the question before us.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 1168-1169.) 15 ayes, 31 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was not successful. I do raise the call. Mr. Clerk, do you have any items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Thank you. Mr. President, Enrollment and Review reports they've examined and reviewed LB 1089 and recommend that same be placed on Select File; LB 1090; LB 1091; LB 1092; LB 514; LB 917; LB 1144; all on Select File. Some have Enrollment and Review amendments attached. LR 274, LR 275, both by Senator Kremer, both calling for interim studies. Both will be referred to the Executive
