SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The house is under call. All members are present or accounted for. Mr. Clerk, read the motion before the body please.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion before the body is Senator Wehrbein's motion to reconsider the vote taken on Senator Chambers' amendment, FA1580, to the Education Committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Asked for a roll call vote, Mr. Clerk, call the question on the...call the roll on the question before the body.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. Legislative Journal page 1179.)
22 ayes, 21 nays on the motion to reconsider, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was not successful to reconsider. I do raise the call. Mr. Clerk, do you have items for the record please.

CLERK: Mr. President, I do. Enrollment and Review reports LB 1071 and LB 297 to Select File. Business and Labor Committee reports LB 930 to General File. A confirmation report by the Transportation Committee, and a new resolution by Senator Bromm, LR 276. That
