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him and, hopefully, he'll speak on that, and I think that's worked out. But just real briefly, most of this amendment is technical. The main part that would be considered nontechnical is in Section 15, and it removes the restriction on the ability of pharmacy technicians to receive oral authorizations to refill prescriptions. And right now, a pharmacy technician, if a patient comes into the pharmacy and they no longer are able to get another prescription, the technician can call the doctor right now, but the doctor cannot tell the technician to go ahead and refill it. The doctor has to tell the pharmacist. And it just corrects that sort of a thing. So that is basically the main change in this bill. The rest of it is pretty much technical, and I will answer any questions if anyone has any. Thank you.
