SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR TYSON: So we've had 65 years of good use from this law?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah.

SENATOR TYSON: Did you ever...do you remember in the Bible where it says, give unto us a law like the law of the Medes and the Persians which altereth not? It's in the book of Daniel, I believe.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I must have missed that in my Bible reading. I don't recall it.

SENATOR TYSON: Well, I can call on my fellow good Christian, Senator Chambers, for verification if you don't believe me. It's just my comment that I can't support this because this is a law that's done sterling service for 69 years and then some busybody comes around and wants to change it. And I can't buy that. I'm sorry.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, Senator Tyson, what did the necktie you bought in 1935 cost you and what does it cost you now?

SENATOR TYSON: Pardon?

SENATOR JANSSEN: What did your necktie cost in 1935 or were you born prior...you probably wasn't wearing a necktie.

SENATOR TYSON: I was four years old in 1935 and I didn't wear neckties, so I really can't, speaking from personal experience. I'd say this would cost about 8 cents.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I...don't try to auction it off for that.

SENATOR TYSON: That's what I paid for it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, don't try to sell it for that.
