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SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President, members of the body, I listen better across the way than I do in here, and I listened very carefully to what Senator Landis had to say. We have a poor system. I think that's what he was saying. We have a poor system. We're at the bottom of a list on the amount that business has to contribute. We have a bill heard by the Business Committee, Business and Labor Committee, which I'm on, to raise it up to \$500. The Business Committee fought it like we were asking for the end of the world and the payout is very, very poor. And I think what they said to us is as, you know, don't touch LB 893 this year. We're going to have to have a comprehensive study. So what we're really doing with this bill that Senator Cunningham has is we're...another little pick at the bus...at the working people. We should look at it comprehensive in next summer or next year or something. We should look at the whole wage benefit process, maybe like Senator Bromm was talking about. This is a piecemeal of it. It's not the full picture, and I think we need to look at the full picture. Is this the right way for benefits? Is the amount of money, the \$7,000, right that we make the business pay? And are...so I think we need a...I supported Senator Chambers on his bracket motion. I support it. I voted the bill out of committee. I guess after I learned more I've come to my senses. And I think that this, we need to just...we should bracket it, the motion, and make the study next year, and the body come back next year to look at this issue. And, Senator Chambers, I would give you the rest of my time if you so desire, or Senator Beutler, or somebody.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers, you have about three minutes left.
