favorably upon the following appointment to the Board of Emergency Medical Services, two appointments to the Child Abuse Prevention Fund Board, and two appointments to the Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. The committee suggests the appointments be confirmed by the Legislature by record vote. The first is Earl Rudolph. That's a reappointment to the Board of Emergency Medical Services. He's an EMT instructor and firefighter who lives in Papillion and works as a training officer for the Fremont Fire Department. He's now entering his twenty-ninth year of service in the fire service entity. The next is Dale Baker, a reappointment to the Child Abuse Prevention Fund Board, from Grand Island. She is a Hall County election commissioner. She was unable to personally appear. Senator Kremer appeared in her support for her confirmation. Third is Elba Cera, a new appointment to the Child Abuse Prevention Fund Board, from Omaha. She's an active leader in the Hispanic community for several years, has experience in management, social work, and nonprofit agency administration. She has a bachelor of arts in social work from Briar Cliff College in Sioux City, Iowa, and a master of arts in management from the Bellevue University. Fourth is Pamela Duin, new appointment to the Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, from Gretna. She's an ICU nurse, mother of four children. Her oldest child, 11-year-old daughter with a moderate profound hearing loss. Senator Combs appeared in support of her confirmation. And last was Barbara Woodhead, a reappointment to the Commission of Deaf and Hard of Hearing, from Lincoln. She is a sign language interpreter employed by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and an active community volunteer. I'd ask for the confirmation of these appointments, Mr. President.
