FLOOR DEBATE

April 6, 2004

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, James Gohl appeared in front of the Natural Resources Committee. The hearing date was April 2. James was appointed to finish out a term, and is now being reappointed to a full term. He appeared before the committee at the hearing. He is from Culbertson, Nebraska. His occupation is a farmer/rancher, and the vice president of operations for Central Operating, Incorporated. Central Operating, Incorporated, currently operates over 200 wells in southwest Nebraska, and including Sleepy Hollow field, the largest field in Nebraska. James is president of the McCook Public Power District Board of Directors, a director of the Nebraska Rural Electric Association, and a member of the McCook Chamber of Commerce Agricultural Task Force, and Hitchcock County Zoning Board, Board of Adjustments. The committee vote was unanimous to recommend his approval to the full Legislature. That concludes my report.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Discussion on the confirmation report? Seeing none, the Chair would recognize Senator Schrock to close. He waives closing. The question is on the Natural Resources Committee confirmation report. All those in favor please vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal pages 1495-1496.) 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the confirmation report.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: The confirmation report is adopted. (Doctor of the day introduced.) Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a second confirmation report from Natural Resources regarding an appointment to the Environmental Trust Board. (Legislative Journal page 1451.)

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Chair would recognize Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, Robert Krohn is one of three representatives from the 2nd Congressional District. Robert was appointed to finish
