A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
2 section 60-6,232, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska;
3 to permit a rotating or flashing amber light on a motor
4 vehicle owned by or operated on behalf of a railroad as
5 prescribed; and to repeal the original section.
6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-6,232, Reissue Revised Statutes of
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 60-6,232. A rotating or flashing amber light or lights
4 shall be displayed on the roof of any motor vehicle being operated
5 by any rural mail carrier outside the corporate limits of any
6 municipality in this state on or near any highway in the process of
7 delivering mail.

8 A rotating or flashing amber light or lights may be
9 displayed on (1) any vehicle of the Military Department while on
10 any state emergency mission, (2) any motor vehicle being operated
11 by any public utility, vehicle service, or towing service or any
12 publicly or privately owned construction or maintenance vehicle
13 while performing its duties on or near any highway, (3) any motor
14 vehicle being operated by any member of the Civil Air Patrol, (4)
15 any pilot vehicle escorting an overdimensional load, ~~or~~ (5) any
16 vehicle while actually engaged in the moving of houses, buildings,
17 or other objects of extraordinary bulk, including unbaled livestock
18 forage as authorized by subdivision (2)(f) of section 60-6,288, or
19 (6) any motor vehicle owned by or operated on behalf of a railroad
20 carrier that is stopped to load or unload passengers.
