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potato chips, jerky and whatever else. But beyond that, they don't need any millions of dollars. Right? And you were being overly optimistic when you drafted an A bill requesting that we appropriate that much in these dire times,...

SENATOR STUHR: Well...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...when it's not even needed right now.

SENATOR STUHR: Actually, if you would look at the yellow sheet, it gives you some estimates. All we could...you know, all we could ask for is estimates because...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The yellow sheet is not law.

SENATOR STUHR: ...at this point we don't...we don't know. But this...you have your yellow sheet, I believe.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's not law. The only thing that would be law is in that salmon-colored or orange-colored sheet. Right? If we take this \$10 million, it won't break your heart, will it?

SENATOR STUHR: Well, I mean, I'm talking about the schools. If you can guarantee that we will have some funding for the telecommunication contracts for next year, how...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I can't guarantee that the world will be standing next year. If we're lucky, everything is gone. Then all of our troubles will be over. Hallelujah.

SENATOR STUHR: Right. I know this is a difficult concept because we really don't know how much will be needed. But what we're trying to do is just...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: ...kind of set up an amount and at least bring this to your attention that this how much we may possibly need.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, would you be vexed if somebody offered an amendment to take all that money out of the A bill, except
