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in it, but I've discussed with you off the floor and I guess...I guess I need to say something on the record about it. I have a little bit of a problem, and maybe it's just me and maybe I'm not thinking this through well, but I have a little bit of a problem with the Legislature appointing a task force. And, you know, I guess my question would be is if this is going to be a legislative study, then maybe we should just make it an interim study resolution rather than creating a task force. But the task force actually will be composed of people who aren't legislators, obviously, and in fact some of them will be members of the executive branch of government, and it seems to me that it would be better to have executive branch involvement in that kind of thing. It's generally how we make appointments. But I could be wrong and I'm willing to listen to the arguments pro and con, but I just don't remember that we've ever had much of this in the past. If it's to be a task force, it's generally appointed by the executive branch of government, maybe the judicial if it involves the law and the judiciary, but I'm having a hard time recollecting...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...when the Legislature, other than last year (laugh) and another one of your bills, other than last year when we did it, I just don't remember it. So I would hope that maybe Senator Beutler or Senator Chambers or someone who's been here longer than I could speak to that issue. But I am going to support your amendment, but what I'm saying is, if we do adopt the amendment, I might want to come back on Select File and discuss that particular part of the issue a little bit more.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Further discussion? Senator Johnson, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the body, the other day when Senator Jensen proposed this amendment to me as a means of compromise, I gave him my very reluctant agreement. One of the things that I thought would happen with this amendment is that we would get a disproportionate positive effect of how wonderful it would be to have all of this economic development going through our state.
