I will sit back and watch happen. It's possible for somebody in business, in the right context, to be among the downtrodden. But since I am the defender of the downtrodden, I would rather do some defending before they are trodden upon. Prevention is better than cure. You know that there are businesses that are operating now. You know that business from them will be siphoned off. You know that they cannot compete with Cabela's. I will grant that. They don't need what is being offered here. And if they needed it, the state ought not to grant it, because it means that Cabela's cannot make it, they cannot function, they cannot generate profit. If they can generate the profit, let them dip into their own money and buy the property and build their establishment and make their money. If then they drive everybody else out of business, that's a part of marketplace ethics, morality, venality, ruthlessness, or whatever it happens to be. But that's where you have created an arena into which you've said everybody can come, no matter how big, small, weak, or strong. But once in that arena, the strongest, the cunningest, the savviest will survive, and the others will perish. But when you have a set of circumstances where there are existing businesses and this other one is not going to come in and play by the rules that these others play by in becoming established, and you're going to tell this big one, we're going to give you a leg up, we're going to give you breaks and concessions that the others did not have, and in giving you those breaks, we're going to put you in a position to break them, to destroy them, that's not fair. Senator Landis can say all he wants to that the competition is not between Cabela's and these businesses they will run out of business, but between Nebraska and Arkansas, or whoever. Tell that to the people who have been maintaining their businesses, who may have...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...thought of it as something they'll pass on to their family members. Tell them, you've got to be sacrificed because Nebraska is fighting with Arkansas. They're two big wheels, and you happen to get crushed between them, but you don't count. Well, what is the purpose of the competition between Arkansas and Nebraska? The purpose is to keep Cabela's in Nebraska. Why do you want to keep Cabela's in Nebraska? So
