The government has certain responsibilities, certain functions to carry out. It must make certain purchases to do what a government does. And the cost of everything increases. Everything. So it is automatic that if a government is going to carry out its functions, it's going to cost more money. And the place where the government gets money is taxation. I'm drafting another amendment while I talk here. And since taxation is the means by which the government gets money, the Legislature has to change...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the tax rate. That means the people on this floor, if we're going to carry out our responsibilities as we should, are not in a position to lie to the public and say in advance, I'm going to cut taxes. Senator Burling does not want to talk about certain costs, or how he will respond to a finding or recommendation by this commission, because he does not want to prejudge. But we've had people even before we came into session prejudging what kind of tax cuts are going to occur, and we don't have any information. But that is the standard dodge, the standard lie that politicians tell the public, because as Hitler said, rulers are fortunate that the people do not think. That's why Hitler made it in Germany, because he told the truth. And he also talked about big lies, and he had a guy named Dr. Goebbels,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Time for what?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Your closing is up. You've heard the closing on FA326. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted to LB...Senator Chambers, for what purpose...?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call say aye; all in favor (sic) vote no. Record please, Mr. Clerk.
