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you can be as ignorant as a white person and get a job. You cannot. Even when you know something, you cannot get the job. So don't be telling me that these white people don't know anything and they get somewhere. White people take care of each other, and that's not good enough for you. And I would not insist that you do something if I were not going to do it first. You all have no idea of the internal in-house discussions that go on between and among black people. You have no idea. But I've spent my whole life around white people. I have never been in a setting where I had a black teacher--elementary school, high school, university, law school. I have never been in a classroom where I was not massively outnumbered by the white people. So I have been around and studied white people all of my life, and I understand white people probably better than you understand yourselves, because I pay attention to what you do. Those things you take for granted, you're unaware of, such as that Betty Friedan's name should not be pronounced Betty "FREEdun." I listen to how you all use the English language, tailgating on the discussion earlier. How many of you all have heard white people say, and you've read it, "enamored with"? It's not "enamored with," it's "enamored of." To help you understand it, substitute the word "fond" for "enamored." You're not "fond wich" somebody, you are "fond of" somebody. So it's "enamored of," not "enamored with." And your most intelligent people...I read white people's literature, and that's the written stuff--poetry, history, novels--and they invariably say "enamored with." How about the word "different" when you're talking about "different from"? They say "different than."

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You use "than" when you're making a comparison. A is bigger than B. You're making a comparison. There are many times when what people are talking about is, one thing is different "from" another, not different "than" another, but they invariably say "different than" instead of "different from." And I cringe. See, I have to pay attention to your language because it's not my indigenous tongue, and I have to learn how to speak it what you all call correctly, even though you don't speak it correctly. And I have another gripe, but
