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always vote the same way on every issue, you can stop me from doing anything. But you have to do it on every issue, or at least 25 of you have to. Can you get the same 25 who will swallow how they feel against certain bills and vote the way you want them to? You can't count on that. People change their minds on bills that they've promised to support, without being locked into some kind of arrangement that I've just described. So I'm going to watch, and maybe I'll be taught something this session, but I'm not going to let these bad bills go, if I have a way to stop them. And I'm going to try, in every way that I can, to stop them.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Mr. Clerk, do you have a motion?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do. Senator Cornett would move to invoke cloture pursuant to Rule 7, Section 10.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Senator Cornett, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CORNETT: I rise to ask for a call of the house, please.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: The motion is to place the house under call. All those in favor signify by voting aye; those opposed, nay. Senator Chambers, do you want a roll call on placing the house under call? No. On the cloture vote? It is recognized. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Thank you. The house is under call. Senators, please record your presence. Those unexcused senators, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Johnson, Senator Schimek, the house is
