SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...although I don't like this bill, I don't think it's necessary, I'm taking it seriously because the body may enact it into law. I have not offered a large number of amendments on this bill, as I've done on occasion, to point out problems with it, and I don't know that I will do that, but this amendment is a serious one. The first one, it allowed for some discussion, but it wasn't a serious one. I agree with Senator Schimek about the kinds of things that ought to be taken into consideration. Senator Janssen, I think it was, talked about similar matters, and Senator Flood got even more specific. I think rather than just give them a roving commission to select any states they choose, we should pin it down somehow and we should be more precise...
