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SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...but I think the state and the federal government have the responsibility to define parameters. I don't think it says anywhere...

SENATOR COMBS: That's correct.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...in the Second Amendment that you have the right to conceal carry. Well, thank you, Senator Combs. I...thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Further discussion? Senator Thompson, and this will be your third time, Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you. I believe that we should have had an opportunity to get to a number of amendments on this bill and make it a better bill and I think they point out a lot of flaws in the bill and why we shouldn't have advanced it. And I really think, you know, I hear a lot from the public about...and I know you all did when you ran, for being efficient in government, for being...watching our pennies carefully, for working very hard to make sure that everything that we do is done in an appropriate fashion. And in this case it would have been far better than setting these numbers in statute to have actual costs be what...and let the State Patrol set the fee for this permit. It covers it maybe for the first two years, but after that there are going to be all sorts of changes, things that are different. We aren't going to know into the future, and we're requiring the State Patrol in five years to do the same thing that they have to do in year one, when the permits come due. It would have been a far better bill, I believe, and as true of a lot of fees that we set, if they were based on actual costs of administering the program. Unlike Senator Combs, I don't think it should be a cash cow. I think it should be a wash. We don't...are passing this bill to make money for other purposes. I don't think that's good legislative policy. What we should be doing is making sure that the State Patrol isn't taking from their other duties to enforce this law. Or just think how long it would take a staff person to check, because my understanding is, at
